


MAP TO BEAR CREEK




.134 acres of rolling land and timber on White River. Canoeing on White River and nearby reservoir. Rich in the lore of the Delaware Indians.






MAP OF CAMP

# GENERAL INFORMATION SECTION



## A SERIOUS WORD ABOUT VEHICLE AND HEALTH AND ACCIDENT INSURANCE

In the course of the year, many Scouting units take trips, go on moving camps or other high adventure activities that require a tour permit.

There are two types of tour permits required. One relates for trips and camps where the destination is less than 250 miles one way. This requires the use of a Local Tour Permit application, catalog #4426, available at any office. If the trip is more than 250 miles one way, a National Tour Permit application is required, catalog #4419. It is asked that Local Tour Permit applications be filed two weeks in advance of scheduled activity for proper clearance. National Tour Permits require at least one month since they must be approved locally as well as in the Regional office in Illinois.

The prime purpose of the tour permit is to guide each of us in making the right kinds of decisions as a part of planning for such a trip. Health and safety are a prime consideration in this. Experience in the past year or two in this council and in many councils across the country causes us to draw to your specific attention the importance of the section on Vehicle Insurance on both permit applications. We must be assured that the minimum limits of coverage are actually in effect on the vehicles used, and this is extremely important for the protection of unit leadership. Real tragedy results when uninsured vehicles or underinsured vehicles are used to transport youngsters and an accident occurs. We have experienced this in this council in the last year. If you cannot attach to such a tour permit application a "Certificate of Insurance" for each vehicle listed, we urge you to write in the appropriate block on the tour permit application the name of the company, the policy number, and the expiration date. This is really for your own protection and your cooperation is strongly urged.

Equally important is making sure that the unit has some form of health and accident insurance on each of its members. Most units purchase this on an annual basis at a very minimal cost. Several plans are available locally and one is available Nationally. Such policies do not cover major catastrophes but they do cover the minimal expenses frequently encountered on a camping or moving trip -- even when parents and families have their own major medical insurance coverage. It is extremely important to keep such insurance current and not let it lapse. It is not required, but we recommend it most strongly from an agent of your choice.







## THE HISTORIC TRAILS PROGRAM



Love of America and devotion to our country depend upon a thorough appreciation of the ideals, principles, and traditions that have made our country strong. Historic Trails Award requirements emphasize cooperation between historic societies

and Scout and Explorer units. A unit should establish a close relationship with a local society as soon as possible when planning a historic activity — most communities have such societies.

Reports from many units indicate that these societies have been eager to offer their cooperation by:

- suggesting trails or sites that are suitable for unit historic activities and exploration
- providing units with historic information about the trails or sites
- offering guidance to units during restoration and marking projects
- financing the cost of materials used by units for restoration and marking projects
- staging historic pageants and ceremonies with unit participation
- directing public attention to unit historic activities through newspapers, television, and radio

If the trip is more than 250 miles from homes of group members (local council camp excepted) or crosses national boundaries and into the territory of other nations, a National Tour Permit Application, No. 4419, is necessary. For trips and overnight camps less than 250 miles, use a Local Tour Permit Application, No. 4426.

### Award Requirements

To earn the award, members of your unit must plan and participate in a historic activity. A unit historic activity requires members to—

1. Locate a historic trail or site and study information relating to it. (The information may be obtained from an adult historic society, public library, or people living near the trail or site.)
2. Hike or camp 2 days and 1 night along the trail or in the vicinity of the site.
3. Cooperate with an adult group such as a historic society to restore and mark all or part of this trail or site. (This may be done during the hike or overnight camp.) Or cooperate with such a group to plan and stage a historic pageant, ceremony, or other public event related to this trail or site—such event should be large enough to merit coverage by the local press.
4. Your unit leader must then file the Historic Trails Award application with your council office.

- Select a suitable trail or waterway.
- Adult leaders over 21 must make the entire trip.
- If the trip is more than 250 miles from homes of group members (local council camp excepted) or crosses national boundaries and into the territory of other nations, a National Tour Permit Application, No. 4419, is necessary. For trips and overnight camps less than 250 miles, use a Local Tour Permit Application, No. 4426.


